Photoshop, an advanced program to manipulate your digital photographs far more extensively than **Picasa**. With this program, you can separate individual elements of your photo to enhance your main subject and correct or eliminate background distractions. Colors, brightness and sharpness can all be modified to suit your artistic vision. Perhaps you have taken a group photo and one person had his eyes closed. If you have a better picture of that person's face, you can transfer it into your group photo. Amazing! Naturally, this program requires a great degree of skill and a lot of practice, but many here are using it successfully.



SECURITY CORNER

Tony Scorsese Oh No! It's gone!

In this age of computer scams and identity theft, one of the oldest and most dreaded experiences is the loss of your wallet. I'm sure that most of you have at one time or another found that your wallet has gone missing. It's one of those very uncomfortable feelings that reach deep down in your stomach. Don't panic. Some things will alleviate the problem.

First, call all your credit card companies and have them **change your account number**. Do not ask to **cancel** your account as that can hurt your credit score, particularly if you have any outstanding balance. You want a new number so that nothing shows up on your credit report as **canceled by consumer**. This is according to the Identity Theft Resource Center.

Contact the three major credit bureaus and ask for a fraud alert on your accounts. You can reach them as follows: Experian1-888-397-3742, Trans Union1-800-680-7289 and Equifax1-800-525-6285. By having a fraud alert in place, creditors are supposed to verify your identity prior to issuing new credit in your name. They will usually do this by phone.

Change your passwords to make sure that an identity thief can't access your accounts. Your passwords should contain letters, numbers and symbols. Don't use your pet's name, mother's maiden name or any other identifiers found online.

Notify your bank. You should obtain a new ATM or debit card.

File a police report as soon as possible both in the place where you last saw your wallet and in your hometown. Make sure you get a copy of the report which you may need later.

Notify the DMV either to **flag** your license file or to replace your license. This will protect you from anyone applying for a copy of your license. This will also protect you from traffic violations charged in your name.

Finally, you should check your credit history approximately two weeks later. This will give sufficient time for thieves to apply for credit but not enough time to issue new cards. Recheck your credit report two to three months later.

Do the following to protect yourself in advance:

Make copies of all your credit cards, both front and back. Do the same for your driver's license, debit cards, insurance cards, library cards, etc. Also, make note of the phone numbers you would need to call should you lose your cards. Having a copy of this information at home or while traveling will give you all the information necessary should the need arise. Don't keep the information in your wallet.





Tip of the Month: Did you know that temperature can greatly affect the way your racket plays? When it is cold your strings will be tighter, thus reducing your power, but aiding control. Conversely, when it is hotter, your strings will be looser and the ball will **fly** off your racket.

Knowing this you can:

1, Adjust your swing (not my favorite thing to do, but it sometimes works).

- 2. Choose to play only when it is cool or hot (your choice).
- 3. Re-string your racket twice a year when the season changes, and/or buy two rackets and string them at different tensions.


